

# HACH FSDATA DESKTOP INSTRUMENT MANAGER, VERSION 1.8.1.5

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR INSTALLING THE SOFTWARE

### INTRODUCTION

Hach FSDATA Desktop is an application that can be used in the field to program Hach FL900 Series Flow Loggers and retrieve collected data from both the Hach FL900 Logger and the Hach AS950 Automatic Sampler. It can also be used both in the field and in the office to view, analyze, and report data. The software runs on both 32-bit and 64-bit versions of Microsoft Windows. Users can display information in any of the six supported languages: English, French, German, Italian, Portuguese, and Spanish.

### Installation Instructions

1. From the Hach web site, download the zip file of the software associated with the applicable language to your computer:
  - FSDDataDesktop\_v1-8-1-5-Deutsch.zip
  - FSDDataDesktop\_v1-8-1-5-English.zip
  - FSDDataDesktop\_v1-8-1-5-Espanol.zip
  - FSDDataDesktop\_v1-8-1-5-Francais.zip
  - FSDDataDesktop\_v1-8-1-5-Italiano.zip
  - FSDDataDesktop\_v1-8-1-5-Portugues.zip

All of the zip files contain installers that will install the same program. However, the installers themselves will prompt the user in the indicated language. Once the application is installed, the user can change the language that the application is displayed in.

2. Extract the files contained in the zip file to a folder. Three files should be extracted: FSDATADesktop32-*ISO Language Code*.msi, FSDATADesktop64-*ISO Language Code*.msi, and ReadMe.pdf (which contains this document). The *ISO Language Codes* are de (German), en (English), es (Spanish), fr (French), it (Italian), and pt (Portuguese).
3. Double click either the 32-bit or 64-bit msi installer file, depending on the operating system of your computer. If you don't know whether your operating system is 32-bit or 64-bit, just pick one of the files. If the wrong file is picked, the user will receive a warning and can then just pick the other version.
4. The installer should then prompt the user for information required to install the software. The prompts are intended to be self explanatory.
5. After the software is installed, launch it either from the Start Menu or the desktop icon. Select the Settings command under the Help menu to change the language and other application-wide settings.
